## Board of Trustees Chairman

Resonate! Yemen annual report 2021 assumes special attention for it comes a few months after Resonate! Yemen has celebrated, in 2020, a decade-long of hard work and significant contributions serving the Yemeni youth. Numerous remarkable contributions have accompanied the institutional development of Resonate! Yemen since its inception as an initiative in 2009. After its official inception in 2011, Resonate! Yemen has continued its fruitful action, which successfully shifted Resonate! Yemen from an idea and initiative concerned with youth concerns to an entity assessing the community needs and exploring how to positively affect the community, to a pioneering foundation in the landscape of youth engagement in public policies across Yemen.

Resonate! Yemen celebrations of its achievements were not in isolation from its growing sense of responsibility towards youth and Yemeni community as a whole. Its constant pursuit of development and institutional commitment was reflected into a holistic review of Resonate! Yemen decade-long activities as well as a deep-root study of Yemeni situation and variables. The outcomes of these major steps constituted the foundations and bases adopted by Resonate! Yemen to draw the new features of its strategic plan, which was developed in 2021 using a participatory approach that enabled all staff to participate in every step of building the new strategic plan. Alongside this, the year 2021 saw multiple unique milestones in the ongoing programs implemented by the foundation; Resonate! Yemen formed a youth network "My Contribution is Development", helped develop eight strategic plans for local authorities, produced one public policy paper

for supporting peace in Yemen, and worked with local mediators to address security concerns and enhance local security. Most notably in 2021, Resonate! Yemen worked on forming a Social Accountability Coalition at nationwide level.

This report presents Resonate! Yemen major achievements during 2021, especially the development of a new strategy for the foundation. It also presents a summary for the key indicators and results at program level, which are the outcome of Resonate! Yemen throughout the year. We look forward to new horizons in 2022, guided by our updated strategic vision through which we aspire to achieve sustainable development at the local level in Yemen through institutional and community partnerships in the public policy landscape. Meanwhile, we adhere to Resonate! Yemen values, including transparency, accountability, partnership, creativity and innovation, quality-focused and self-development.

The Board of Trustees feels great confidence that 2022 would be a new and strong start for Resonate! Yemen. 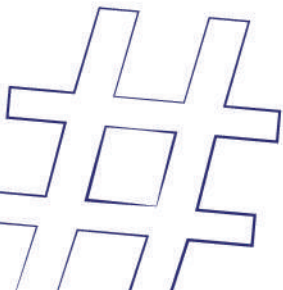


## #Active\_Youth\_Safe\_Community

institutions, who contributed to the success of Resonate! Yemen's projects.

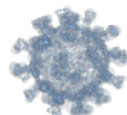
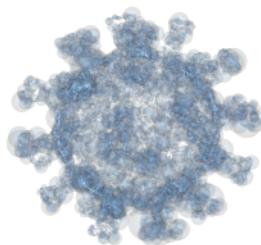

## Work Policy for Coping with COVID-19 Challenges




COVID-19 wave swept the world for the second consecutive year, giving rise to a wide range of threats and risks which were detrimental to human survival. This was clearly reflected on all community sectors, including organizations which were no exception to the repercussions of this pandemic. CSOs faced big challenges which affected their plans, activities and implementation mechanisms during 2021. These challenges made CSOs adopt with the new work environment and create conducive conditions to ensure work continuity while considering COVID-19 preventive measures, including the provision of PPEs recommended

by concerned bodies.

At the foundation's level, Resonate! Yemen adopted new policies to cope COVID-19 outbreak and protect its staff. The policy of operations management and field posts was amended to adhere to the preventive measures, including raising people's awareness of the pandemic risks and preventive methods, providing PPEs, enduring social distancing and home quarantine when needed, enhancing health insurance for Resonate! Yemen staff and applying modern work-from-home methods and tasks follow up.

For self-initiatives to control COVID-19 wave, Resonate! Yemen implemented a "Virtual Hackathon" to contain the virus in Yemen, believing in the importance of adopting the creativity of promising youth and activating the role of community during the emergency state. This Virtual Hackathon was implemented in partnership with ROWAD Foundation and Al-Atmi Innovative Consulting Company, and sponsored by Lamasat Advertising and Hayel Saeed Anam Group.



The virtual event was primarily objectivized to control COVID-19 through stimulating competition between individuals and companies to propose innovative enterprises and best ideas that fit with the local situation of Yemen. The Virtual Hackathon was fully launched on social media platforms. Three competing enterprises\* were awarded three different grants based on the judging panel assessment.

## Work Methodology on Community Issues **2021**

Throughout 2021, Resonate! Yemen continued operations concurrently with developing its strategic plan with the help of experts who were able, through the staff, to lay the foundations for a three-year strategic plan, which constitutes a collective vision for our team that seeks to achieve a solid methodological link between what is being implemented and what it seeks to achieve. In this year, Resonate! Yemen staff felt the clarity of the vision and strategic objectives which were reflected on the different projects' activities, including priority needs assessment for Yemeni community and effective response to target group needs within the strategic objectives.

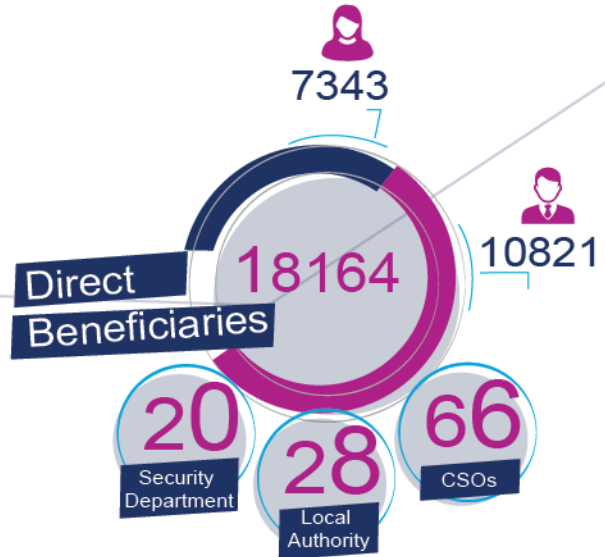

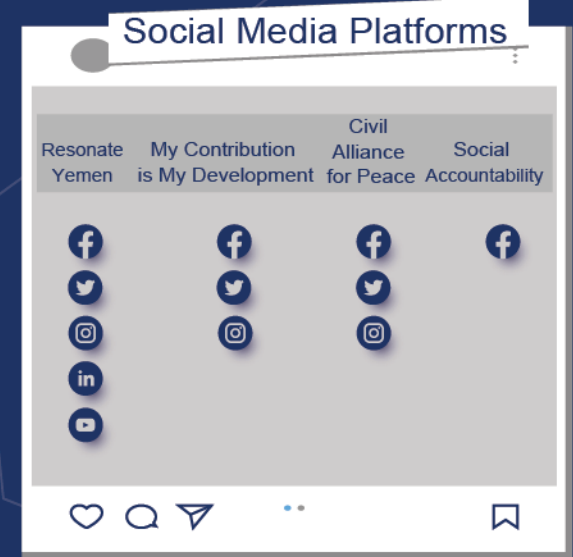

The Public Policy Fellowship was something different with Resonate! Yemen, especially for me. I had joined several programs with local and international organizations, but I felt a real difference after the fellowship program. I worked as a consultant with the local authority technical office in Ma'rib governorate and was able to influence decision-makers. I focused on the role of women in the local authority and drafted a paper in this regard, which was the foundation for a training program which targeted 10 women and resulted in including them within the administrative offices in the governorate, as well as the Health and Education Offices. During the program, I learned how to implement a roundtable with decision makers, and I was able to manage a number of roundtables to advocate for women's issues. The beautiful thing is that I am currently working on implementing the same programs for 80 women in Marib and advocating for their participation in the local authority executive offices. I am influenced by the Resonate! Yemen experience, focusing on a particular group. I got to know many young graduates of Resonate! Yemen programs who have become young leaders in the governorate, and we are trying to manage Ma'rib Girls Foundation the same way as Resonate! Foundation. The status of Resonate! Yemen today represents an incentive for the future of Ma'rib Girls Foundation.

## My Development is My Contribution Project

As a foundation that works on building more sustainable policies that accept youth as key partners in the development and decision-making processes in Yemen, Resonate! Yemen implemented “My Development is My Contribution” project which aimed to strengthen community resilience and self-reliance of conflict-affected communities in Yemen, creating the conditions for long-term reconstruction and development in partnership with local development partners through capacitating youth, CSOs and district-level local authorities. To boost the role of youth and local councils, joint meetings, initiatives and conferences were held between local authorities and youth, and strategic plans were drafted for each target district.

Amplifying a Path to Peace Project in Yemen aimed to provide broad-based support for sustainable peacebuilding among influential stakeholder in Yemen. It focuses on strengthening local efforts and spreading the culture of peace, tolerance and reconciliation among community members as well as mobilization and advocacy to support peace issues in Yemen. This is to achieve wide understanding and Yemeni civilian support for UN-led peace process and bringing the Yemenis' issues which might affect on sustainable peace agreements to the priorities of actors in the first and second paths.

The period I spent with Resonate! Yemen was the first step of my involvement in community participation. Over a year and a half, I received a training under the umbrella of “My Development is my Contribution” project. It provided us with abundant of knowledge and equipped us skills that quickly turned into experiences through founding my Wi'am Youth Initiative, which was launched in the first half of the year. After the project, I became an active and influential person, more involved in social and political programs, and participated in several events, programs, and advocacy campaigns.

Resonate! Yemen continued to support us after the project and partnered with us in community work. This was achieved through financing the Digital Advocacy Campaigns project that Resonate! Yemen implemented in partnership with Sheba Youth Foundation and Wi'am Initiative that I chair. I still hope to have more partnerships with Resonate! Yemen.



## Strengthening Local Security in Yemen

Through Strengthening Local Security Program in Yemen, Resonate! Yemen addressed the role of local mediators in enhancing relations between local authorities, local security forces and local communities. The program trained local mediators on conflict resolution and dialog facilitation, and the local security forces were trained on the rights of detainees and suspects in local and international laws, legal and investigation procedures, mediation, conflict resolution, community response, communications, community engagement and handling community abuse victims. The program implemented community dialogs and local forums between the security forces and local authorities in governorates and districts on one hand, and local communities on the other hand, which were facilitated by local mediators and partners.

The Civil Alliance for Peace<sup>\*</sup>(CAP) has been playing a vital role since 2020 as a national mediator through obtaining grants from donors and allocating them to active CSOs in peacebuilding and youth and women issues in order to implement projects to reduce community and political conflicts and spreading the culture of tolerance and coexistence in different governorates. The CAP also partners in implementing these projects.

The CAP is of local character, and thus its member CSOs are close to local communities needs and issues, which are later translated into projects. I believe that the CAP will be the primary reference for peacebuilding in Yemen and the link with international organizations, and it will provide the necessary reports through applying the theory of change, assessment and long-term impact analysis of projects implemented in Yemen. I call on Resonate! Yemen to continue supporting the CAP as it has contributed a lot to the CAP inception.

## CSO Sustainability Index for Yemen

Since 2017 and on a yearly basis, Resonate! Yemen has been submitting a report on the effectiveness and viability of CSOs in Yemen through publishing a yearly report with 74 countries around the world. The report aims to assess the CSO sector sustainability in the country through seven key components or “dimensions”: legal environment, organizational capacity, financial viability, advocacy, service provision, sectoral infrastructure and public image. The report sheds light on the achievements of CSOs in Yemen and the obstacles they face or might face to assess their needs, build their capacities and advocate for their issues.

## Communication, amity and connection!

Resonate! Yemen and its management make sure to create various communication channels with all community components to form an important tributary for building and designing their interventions to bridge the needs of the target groups. To achieve effective communications, the Chairman of Board of Trustees Mr. Rafat Ali Al-Ak'hali, ex-Minister of Youth and Sports in the government of technocrats, fellow in Governance College at the University of Oxford, the Convenor of the Council on State Fragility, along with Mr. Assem Al-Ashry the advisor of governance and public policies at Resonate! Yemen, paid a visit. During their visit, a number of meetings and seminars were held with young people, during which the youth roles were discussed to create a development conducive environment where the youth can participate in leading

creative initiatives in their communities. Also, an independent analysis of peace process and international parties' positions regarding crisis in Yemen were introduced, and challenges and opportunities for building the national economy were discussed.

Alongside meetings with youth, several meetings were held with local leaders and social figures to draft a vision for development needs within governorates. All of these meetings were full of hope and the belief that reality can be better and that we can overcome challenges if the belief in the role of each individual within his/her community and the importance of his/her contribution to change for the better is strengthened.
