





The "Enhancing Local Security in Yemen" program activities follow the 25-months, which ended in October 2022. Through this program, Resonate! Yemen funded and supported 45 CSOs to create safe spaces among the community members, local authorities, and security forces and implement security and safety projects and advocacy projects proposed and prioritized by local residents in Yemen, who participated in the safe space, that strengthened local security and safety and restored basic security. Under a program that benefited more than 24,501 Yemenis (14,562 males, 9,939 females) across Taiz, Aden, Shabwa, Marib, and Hadramout governorates.

Under 20 security and safety grants, the program established security operations rooms, rehabilitated war, and flood-affected security facilities, supplied police stations and traffic police with basic equipment, and built the technical and practical capacities of administrative personnel and security units' officials. 38 Security Administrations benefited from the security and safety initiatives' interventions.

Resonate! Yemen awarded 20 advocacy grants to advocate issues that would enhance security such as campaigns for the ceasefire and prevent the unauthorized carrying of weapons, activate the role of women police, counter the spread of drugs among youths, drug use in armed polarization, improve conditions of detention for detained women and juveniles.





The advocacy activities resulted in a national advocacy campaign conducted under the hashtag "#Safe_Community" by 46 CSOs. More than 2 million views and reactions were received on the content and messages associated with the national-level campaign, which was intended to increase awareness around the safety and security issues identified by the local communities. Resonate!Yemen also established safe spaces and communication channels at local, governorate, and national levels through local youth community facilitators to discuss the security and safety issues raised by the local communities through conducting local forums, community dialogues, governorate-level roundtables, and national-level roundtables that included representatives from various society components Local Authorities, Local Security Forces, CSOs, youth, and women.

Due to the safe spaces creation, the local, governorate, and national level discussion makers and officials became more aware of security and safety issues at the district and governorate levels, and more aware of the interventions and limitations in regard to these issues. 328 decisions and decrees were issued and activities were implemented by the discussion makers who attended the safe space at the governorate and national levels. Moreover, social accountability at the district and governorate levels were enhanced due to the participation of community members along with local authorities and security forces in producing and implementing proposals and solutions and also following up on the results.



The program, in addition, enhanced the capacities of 23 high-level security forces at the national level and 370 local security forces and law enforcement officials at the governate level on international & Yemeni laws, legal & regulatory capacity, and trust building with the community to restore and maintain safety in their areas with proper institutional support. 100% of trainees who were interviewed during the end evaluation said that their knowledge, skills, and practices are improved and they had started applying what they had learned in reality.

The program activities contributed to increasing trust between the community members, local authorities, and security forces. This was confirmed by safe space participants who were interviewed during the program end evaluation. According to 93% of participants of the Community Dialogues, 94% of participants of the Local Forums, and 100% of participants of the Governorate Level Roundtables, these safe spaces successfully built the trust between the communities and the local authorities and security forces and supported the formulation of security regulations and practices that are responsive to local needs while reflecting international best standards.



In its ongoing context of advancing improvement, Resonate! Yemen Foundation had implemented a project of knowledge-exchange visits between Marib Governorate and the State of Rwanda, within the project of "Strengthening Institutional and Economic Resilience in Yemen" (SIERY).

The project aimed to provide an affluent learning experience for the senior leadership of the executive offices in Marib with their counterparts in Rwanda, which helps reflect practical plans to improve response, service delivery, stimulate local economic development, and expand the resource base in Marib governorate.

The overall objectives of this project included inspiring and building the capacity of the senior administrative leadership in Marib governorate, increasing its effectiveness through knowledge sharing with its peers in Rwanda, in addition to providing a space to explore any shortcomings that occurred in the past and to find appropriate solutions. Furthermore, it comprised sharing experience of the local authority of Marib in providing services during the conflict and developing concrete action plans to improve response and stimulate the economy.



The project began with the preparation of reading materials on how Rwanda is developing and establishing a list of participants in cooperation with the Office of the Governor of Marib, followed by an exchange visit to Kigali, Rwanda, and concluded with a workshop to collect results and a post-evaluate visit.

It is noteworthy that the delegate that was sent to the State of Rwanda consisted of 11 individuals from Marib's local authority governorate. The purpose was to transfer expertise and benefit from Rwanda's experience. The delegate returned to Marib governorate to start off the desired change process and the clear impact of this mission.

As part of the impact achieved by the project, the members of the mission began to develop concrete plans to improve the response in providing urban services and stimulate economic development for immediate implementation. For example, the plans of the Cleaning and Improvement Fund resulted in dedicating a specific day each month to conduct for the cleanliness of the city of Marib. It would be conducted with wide community participation; creating community awareness that such are participatory responsibilities. They are not responsibilities born solely by the local authority. The outputs of this project continue to manifest in other fields, thus, transferring the experience optimally in a way that better fits the reality and society.





The Resonate! Yemen Social Accountability Project aims to raise awareness about accountability and its tools, while also enhancing this concept among organizations, institutions, and local authorities. The ultimate objective is to contribute towards improving the quality of public services.

This project has been successfully implemented for the fourth time, establishing a wide range of partnerships with civil society institutions and organizations working in the field of social accountability. These partnerships have been formed in various Yemeni governorates, further strengthening the reach and impact of the project.

An important focus of the project is to enhance the delivery of public services and foster long-term partnerships to support and strengthen social accountability on a larger scale. These partnerships with local partners have served as a solid foundation for building a new chapter in the development and implementation of social accountability mechanisms in Yemen.



The goal of the "Impact Maker" program, implemented by Resonate! Yemen, with the support of PAX, is to shape and reinforce the technical capacities of youth and to qualify them to be active community leaders and peacebuilders who take the responsibility of the issues of their local communities, thus addressing these issues in coordination with local authorities and the community.

The project supported young women and men to enhance peace in their communities. The activities were to equip them to undertake different skills required to work and collaborate with local communities, understand the role of different peace-building concepts, find opportunities for youth participation in governance processes, and design advocacy and lobbying activities.

The outputs of the project were comprised of two training phases for youth in five topics, including leadership skills, governance, community needs identification, project preparation, conflict management, and gender. The formation of a youth network of 21 young people was one of the outputs as well, all of which will contribute to empowering youth in designing and advocating public policies on issues of peace and inclusive accountability. Another training phase for local councils in the three targeted districts was conducted as another output of the project.

In addition, the project included conducting workshops, networking, and exchanging experiences obtained by the participants during the implementation stages of the program, which in turn enabled young people to contribute to community development and lay the foundations of





community peace in coordination with the leaders of the local authority and local and international organizations, which resulted in activating channels of communication between youth and the local councils. Furthermore, 10 community initiatives were implemented by the Impact Maker youth network in their three districts.

The project supported local councils by signing agreements of understanding and working on technical cooperation programs, which were represented in training the staff of the local council and executive offices. Additionally, the project sought through its activities to stimulate community participation among citizens and achieve progress in the provision of public services.

This project resulted in the issuance of 3 formal decisions to form the Community Committee for Peace and Community Partnership consisting of youth and the local authority, and issued 12 official memorandumt of cooperation to facilitate the work and activities of young people in the field, in the ten initiatives for women and community security, at a time when the capabilities of young people in community contribution have grown, becoming active and participating in various community projects and activities.



Research Guidance Project in the Preparation of Public Policy Papers



Yemen successfully implemented the Research Guidance Project to prepare public policy papers addressing critical societal issues.

The program focused on equipping six talented young men and women with the necessary skills to create and advocate for public policy papers using various media formats, including written, audio, and visual content shared on multiple social media platforms.

These policy papers delved into the economic, political, and social dimensions that have significantly impacted the lives of Yemenis. They encompassed vital subjects such as peacebuilding, societal peace, and governance in Yemen. The papers also addressed challenges stemming from societal conflicts due to power outages, barriers to women's community participation and travel, the war's effects on small and micro enterprises, and the challenges facing by emerging projects during the conflict.



Notably, these research-driven papers were acclaimed and approved by experts in the field of public policy analysis, achieving an impressive 60% score in terms of coherence and clarity in defining the issues, which will benefit those working on issues of peacebuilding, societal peace and governance in Yemen.

Leveraging the success of the policy papers after their comprehensive evaluation, the researchers orchestrated a collaborative advocacy campaign entitled #تقي بطريق آمن# (meaning: my right to a safe road) to shed light on the struggles facing Yemeni people due to inadequate road infrastructure. The campaign effectively utilized social media platforms, podcasts, and a short film, successfully reaching 408,776 individuals.

The campaign strategically conveyed its messages to decision-makers and the local and international communities, aiming to prompt solutions that address the underlying problems. The road issue was identified as a critical focal point, as it resonated with the broader range of issues discussed in the policy papers.



Resonate Talks is a platform focused on creating safe spaces in which influencers and peacebuilders have got a platform under one roof to discuss, exchange experiences, and advocate for different peacebuilding approaches. This nationally organized safe space allowed the voices and ideas of young activists, peacebuilders, and community leaders to not only influence local and national but also have a regional and international one. The event was carried out by 44 volunteers (21 Females - 23 Males) and distributed into five groups such as logistics, stage management, videography & photography, social media, and etc. Eight activists (4 males, and 4 females) have been selected to be the RTalks speakers in order to communicate and advocate their efforts and peacebuilding messages to the audience. The event was conducted in Hadramout and more than a hundred attended and the event from different parts of the Yemeni community. An advocacy campaign was also conducted on Facebook (The most popular social media platform in Yemen) where we advocated for different concepts of peacebuilding, coexistence, and an introduction of the purpose of Resonate Talks event. Rtalks was designed to be close to the culture of the people so it would help in promoting the core values and goals of the platform. All posts, logos, and colors were inspired by the local culture of Hadramout- Yemen. The name of the event was (Boukaa Raydha: a local dialect) which means (A Convenient Place: where people can stay and live in peace).

After the implementation of the in-person event, the team worked to translate the speeches of the influencers so the videos would be English subtitled. A publishing and sponsoring plan was set to start the online campaign targeting the two most popular platforms for Yemenis which are Facebook and Instagram. By June 2022, the campaign has a total reach of 1.081.000 and has total views of 376K.

According to the Rosonate! Talk event's speaker survey assessment, 100% of respondents confirmed gaining new knowledge and skills. 43% Confirmed using of knowledge and skills gained at the personal level. Most of The Resonate Talk Speakers were totally agreed about the Information gained was applicable, Useful, and Correct. 100% of respondents were agreed on the importance of the knowledge and skills to his/her job success.

According to the Rosonate! Talk event's audience's survey assessment, 80% of respondents confirmed getting new information from Resonate Talk Event. 96% of respondents confirm Getting Positive affected by the Resonate Talk Event.

It can be concluded that the envisaged objectives have been achieved perfectly, and such type of event has a great impact create safe spaces in which influencers or peacebuilders have platforms in different parts of Yemen under one roof to discuss, exchange experiences and advocate for them within different approaches to peacebuilding.








The Program, implemented by Resonate! Yemen aims to develop and broadly support sustainable peace among influential stakeholders in Yemen...The Amplifying a Path to Peace (APPY) in Yemen project was a 43 months long project implemented by Resonate Yemen in partnership with PILPG from 2019 – 2021. The APPY Project was designed to build upon these past attempts to influence and support the peace process and fill the gaps in funding and information sharing, therefore enabling Track 1 and 2 actors to develop "a goal-oriented political strategy that aligns with local interests." Resonate trained the 36 implementing local partners in advocacy and data collection. The trained implementing partners in turn trained sub implementing partners.

To achieve this goal, the Civil Peacebuilding Coalition and other civil society organizations will have the opportunity to engage in two types of activities, including media and advocacy campaigns by Yemeni civil society organizations in support of the UN-led peace process. At the same time, Yemeni civil society organizations will collect and analyze Yemenis' views on the peace process. Yemeni civil society organizations will have the opportunity to share the information gathered with actors in the first and second tracks.

Moreover, the project has strengthened the work of the Civil Coalition for Peace in Yemen in the field of peace, in light of the need for similar projects to develop its capacities.

Furthermore, the coalition's capabilities in terms of implementing research activities were strengthened through the establishment of 5,763 questionnaires, 135 focus group discussions, 316 in-depth interviews, and the development of four in-depth studies, 11 policy papers and position papers, in addition to advocacy activities through which 2 field and remote debates were implemented about peace. More than 15 videos and two songs were produced to advocate for various issues encountered in the Yemeni society. They were produced through the institutions under the coalition, aiming to largely contribute to the promotion of the peace concepts among the community.





Resonate!Yemen made a deliberate effort in recent years to establish diverse lines of communication with various stakeholders, including youth, women, local and security authorities, and local civil society organizations.

In 2022, Resonate! Yemen significantly advanced its international relations with the global community by conducting 33 meetings with international organizations and development agencies engaged in Yemen's development and peacebuilding. These discussions focused on future interventions in Yemen, alongside participation in 16 international conferences and seminars. A noteworthy milestone was the Foundation's pioneering conference held in Amman, Jordan, which explored the role of local authorities in the development of Yemen. The conference was attended by 40 participants, including prominent leaders from local authorities in Aden, Hadhramout, Marib, Shabwa, and Taiz. Government representatives from ministries such as the Ministry of Planning, Ministry of Social Affairs, and Ministry of Local Administration also participated, alongside representatives from international organizations and development agencies operating in Yemen.

Building upon this proud accomplishment, we were entrusted with facilitating a roundtable discussion between global development civil society organizations and the World Bank Council as a part of the World Bank's Annual Meetings Program in Washington.

International Meetings and Conferences







Afaq Shababia Foundation

The Afaq Shababia Foundation, established in 2013 in Aden, is a local development foundation that focuses on promoting development and peacebuilding within the community.

As an implementing partner in the governorates of Aden, Lahj, Abyan, and Al-Dhalea, the Afaq Foundation actively participated in the APPY project. Through engaging in debate activities, conducting research, and supporting youth initiatives, the Foundation played a significant role. It successfully organized two youth debates aimed at promoting peacebuilding and provided training to over 20 youth initiatives on implementing advocacy campaigns. Additionally, the Foundation financially supported 11 youth initiatives to implement activities promoting peacebuilding in Aden and Lahj. Throughout the project, Afaq conducted 1083 questionnaires and 37 focus interviews to gather the viewpoints of Yemenis regarding peacebuilding efforts in the aforementioned governorates.

During the 3-year span of Afaq Foundation's involvement in the APPY project, Afaq's staff received extensive training in advocacy, debate skills, field research, and financial work. These trainings significantly enhanced their knowledge and skills, improved the Foundation's financial and administrative work, and strengthened its conceptual perspective and standing among donors.

The APPY project also fostered strong relationships between Afaq

and local community organizations in various governorates. This was achieved through regular meetings, workshops, and both in-person and remote trainings. Furthermore, the project's activities led by the Foundation enhanced its societal impact and expanded its reach to a larger number of youth, youth initiatives, and influential individuals at the local level.

Despite facing challenges such as the COVID-19 pandemic and the need to transition to remote implementation of activities, Afaq successfully overcame these obstacles with the help of relevant training and was able to carry out the project activities effectively.

Looking ahead, the team at Afaq Shababia Foundation views the completion of the APPY project as a significant milestone and a crucial steppingstone towards their continued growth and sustainability. They believe that the expertise and experiences gained throughout the project will continue to benefit them and guide their future endeavors.



In the activity of the research component of the APPY project – implementation in Socotra – Qalansiya:

Socotra Island, also known as Socotra Governorate, is a location where projects and activities are rarely carried out for several reasons. One of these reasons is its geographical location, which poses challenges for implementation. Additionally, the Socotra dialect, spoken on the island, is completely different from the Yemeni dialects, making communication difficult. Furthermore, the distance between institutions and the island makes project implementation particularly challenging. However, the APPY project has defied these obstacles and disproven the belief that projects cannot be successfully executed on the island. Instead of using traditional direct communication methods, the project was implemented remotely. This approach presented its own set of difficulties. For example, we had to overcome geographical distance by delivering mobile phones to surveyors and researchers via airlines. Additionally, the selection of qualified personnel for the project was challenging due to the limited number of educated individuals on the island who were capable of participating in distance communication and implementation. Another obstacle was the poor network and internet connections, although Qalansiya had a relatively better connection. At times, alternative communication networks had to be used at a higher cost. Despite these challenges, the training provided to surveyors and researchers enabled them to successfully utilize tools such as Kubo, Zoom, and internet uploads. This accomplishment stands as a major success story for the project in Socotra Governorate. The implementation of this activity was carried out by the Bin Habreesh Foundation, and it is truly remarkable considering the initial perception that such implementation .would be nearly impossible





The "Leaders for Development" project has significantly contributed towards enhancing the capacities and skills of its beneficiaries, like Amjad from Hadramout. Through this project, he received training in various areas such as peacebuilding, development project preparation, and advocacy campaigns, which enabled him to further refine his theoretical, practical, and applied skills.



Policewomen Taiz, Marib, Hadramout, Aden, Shabwa Governorates

It all began with the initiation of community dialogues, where the inclusion of "policewomen" as a crucial topic for discussion was paramount. The outcomes of these dialogues, in collaboration with the local authority, became evident through the overwhelming support, encouragement, and empowerment provided to policewomen. The response received underscored the significance of the matter within the Taiz governorate. Policewomen were granted increased authority, support, and the necessary resources to effectively address cases involving juveniles and women. These measures were complemented by efforts to encourage the enrollment of women in the women's police force, resulting in the appointment of a director for the women's police in Marib governorate. Consequently, this facilitated the consolidation and proper organization of the policewomen's work in the region. Moreover, dedicated policewomen offices and departments were established and furnished. Consequently, a pressing need arose to prepare and train female recruits, and this was successfully achieved by recruiting 90 policewomen in 2022 and implementing their role in key positions at Marib's main entrances. The same level of training, qualification, and empowerment were undertaken in Hadhramout. In Aden, policewomen were empowered to reach decision-making positions, which was a desired objective. Indeed, official decisions were made to appoint policewomen as assistant directors of departments responsible for protecting family issues. Additionally, policewomen's competencies were enhanced through targeted trainings such as the understanding of detainees' rights under international and national laws, the strengthening of the relationship between local security forces and the community, the enhancement of legal and police capacities of security officers, and the preservation of the rights of suspects. Also, private offices within six police stations were furnished to ensure policewomen could work on family and child protection cases with adequate privacy. This facilitated their consistent presence, capability to handle cases, and official participation in police centers. In Shabwa, directives were issued to accommodate women who aspired to join the women's police in the governorate. All of these concerted efforts have marked a significant stride in advancing the cause of policewomen. Each initiative was taken with the aim of empowering them and bolstering their abilities.

The Anti-Narcotics Department and the Criminal Evidence Department have enhanced their coordination.

The Anti-Narcotics Department did not have the basic furniture and equipment to function properly and was relying on simple and personal equipment provided by employees. The Criminal Evidence Department also lacked basic work equipment and tools for the staff. The department faced a shortage of forensic examination materials for analyzing crime scene samples, which resulted in the need to send samples outside the governorate for examination. This process was highly time-consuming and took approximately one and a half months to obtain results. As a result, court proceedings on related cases experienced delays, making it challenging for security agencies to control the spread of crimes.

According to the Manager of the Criminal Evidence Department, "The intervention of the program made a significant difference. Now, when any sample comes to us for examination, the report will be ready the next day. This change occurred because the program provided us with equipment and tools and trained our staff in examining narcotic substances and toxins, as well as fingerprints and firearms. Our laboratory, established with support program assistance, has been evaluated as an excellent and modern facility."

The program has also rehabilitated the offices of the Anti-Narcotics Department, including the addition of a training hall and the training of its staff. Furthermore, a hotline has been established to facilitate easy and secure communication between citizens and the administration, ensuring a smooth flow of information to combat drug spread in the valley and the desert.

Currently, there is a strong coordination between the Criminal Evidence Department and the Anti-Narcotics Department in both the valley and the desert.
